

Security devices may be installed at any service center property leased or owned. Other measures may be taken to prevent intrusions or disturbances from occurring in service center buildings or trespassing on service center grounds leased or owned. The service center will cooperate with law enforcement in security matters and shall, as required by law and this policy, report felonies and misdemeanors committed at the service center or on service center property.

Reporting Crimes at the Service Center to Law Enforcement

Unless reporting would violate the terms of any memorandum of understanding between the service center and local law enforcement, any service center employee who knows or has reason to believe any of the following has occurred at the service center; on service center property leased or owned; or at a service center-sponsored activity, program, or event shall immediately report this information to local law enforcement. The executive director shall be notified as soon as possible.

Reportable events would include:

- any act which constitutes the commission of a felony or a misdemeanor;
- or
- any act which involves the possession, use or disposal of explosives, firearms or other weapons as defined in current law.

Reporting Certain Students to Administrators and Staff

Administrative, professional, or paraprofessional employees of the service center who have information that any of the following has occurred

shall report the information and the identity of the student responsible to the executive director.

Reportable events include:

- A student being expelled for conduct which endangers the safety of others;
- A student being expelled for commission of felony type offenses;
- A student being expelled for possession of a weapon;
- A student being adjudged to be a juvenile offender for an offense, which, if committed by an adult, would constitute a felony, except to a felony theft offense involving no direct threat to human life;
- A student being tried and convicted as an adult for any felony, except theft involving no direct threat to human life.

The program coordinator shall investigate the matter and, if it is confirmed, the program coordinator shall provide appropriate information and the identity of the student responsible to the executive director, sponsoring district superintendent and all employees who are involved in or likely to be directly involved in teaching or providing related services to the student.

Staff Immunity

No board of directors, board member, executive director of service center or service center employee shall be liable for damages in a civil action resulting from a person's good faith acts or omission in complying with the requirements or provisions of the Kansas school safety and security act.
